FRESNO HOUSING PARTNERSHIPS

Fresno Housing Authority and other non-profit organizations collaborate to provide quality affordable housing to the homeless population using the "housing first" model. Fresno Housing assists with housing regulations while the non-profit organizations provide case management and wraparound services to ensure stability for the individual or family.

FRESNO HOUSING PARTNERSHIPS

Roles of the PHA

- Conduct criminal background screening
- Provide multiple leads on rental properties in the community/connect landlords and agencies
- Conduct a Housing Quality Standard (HQS) physical inspection of the property
- Ensure properties selected are rent reasonable and verify the owner of the property
- Provide property management guidance for agencies that master lease
- Ensure compliance with HUD regulations
- Emotional support for each other (vent sessions!)

COLLABORATION TO PROVIDE AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Roles of Partnering Agencies

Obtain Resources: community food pantry, clothing, furniture donations,
 government phones assistance and utilities assistance

 Case Management: assistance with housing location, housing retention, connection to community resources as needed

 Grant Management: evaluate and ensure excellence in service delivery; use of data to document success

PROPERTY OWNERS

- Fresno is a very tight-knit community with relationships with multiple property owners/property management companies
- When fostering relationships we often ask ourselves "would we live here?"
- We promote our programs when building such relationships and take care of our landlords
